At last report, the southern pair were protecting their territory as well, and had two eggs on one of the Artificial Nesting Platforms. If things go well, we might have two more chicks just before the Fourth of July.

There is also an active challenger on the lake who continues to challenge in both southern territories. The chick observes and stays away.

I look forward to waving and smiling at you all and hopefully a chat or two in the years to come.



Wakeboarding & Wake Surfing Resolution

The State of Wisconsin has introduced a bill to regulate wakeboarding and wake surfing. The proposed bill does not address some issues and also does not allow local government to put rules into effect that are more stringent. All lakes are different and local municipalities should have a say in the rules.

On May 14, 2024, the Chippewa County Board passed a resolution to address their concerns regarding Assembly Bill 2023 AB 656 setting standards for wake surfing and wakeboarding.

This is not an ordinance or law, but a resolution addressing our concerns of the proposed bill. This

resolution has been forwarded to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, State Representative Rob Summerfield, State Representative Karen Hurd, State Senator Jesse James, the Wisconsin Land & Water Conservation Association, and the Wisconsin Counties Association.

Additional Information on Wakeboarding & Wake Surfing Resolution

The resolution from Chippewa County to address concerns regarding WI Assembly Bill 2023 AB 656 included the following recommendations [quoted directly]:

- 1. Requiring that wakesurfing and wakeboarding operation occur at least 600 feet from the shore to prohibit enhance wake creation in waters.
- 2. Prohibiting wakesurfing and wakeboarding in waters shallower than at least 20 feet in depth.
- 3. Requiring that wakesurfing and wakeboarding operation only occur on lakes with a minimum average of 500 acres and at least 50 acres of contiguous minimum depth of 20 feet.
- 4. Requiring that wakesurfing and wakeboarding only occur at a minimum distance of 300' from other watercraft.

Assembly Bill 656 failed to pass in the Wisconsin Legislature on 04/15/24.

"With no action to regulate the impact of enhanced wakes on a statewide level in Wisconsin passing, the 2024 boating season will operate under the status quo from previous years. Local ordinances remain the only method to regulate impacts on specific lakes, and over a dozen municipalities have chose to do so.

Whether the next session of the Legislature, which starts in January after elections this November, will result in any new action on the state level remains to be seen. The issue received considerable attention and seemed to have bipartisan momentum at points, with vocal advocates for meaningful, science-based standards pushing back and successfully holding off AB656/SB680."
